Project Updates

- Dormant Pruning was completed in early March to rejuvenate overgrown shrubs throughout our community, extending their life, and reducing the need for replacements of unhealthy shrubs.
- Annual spring walk to identify diseased or dying trees, damaged grass, and landscaping enhancements will occur in May. If you have any areas of concern, please report them to our property manager.
- 2025 **concrete repairs and asphalt replacement** have been completed! Thank you for everyone's cooperation in relocating vehicles from impacted driveways.
- The posts for the remaining **curbside address signs** are scheduled to be painted black, to coordinate with our new house numbers and post boxes.

Reminders

Exterior of Units | At this time of year we ask all homeowners to please inspect the exterior of your unit to identify any necessary repairs, and to report them to our property manager.

Late Assessments | Payments are due on the 1st of the month, and fines are assessed after the 15th.

Dryer Vent Cleaning | This is a great time for homeowners to have their dryer duct cleaned to prevent fires. Buildups of lint in dryer exhaust ducts are one of the most common causes of house fires.

Grills and Smokers | Can only be used on patios, never on decks. Grills must be stored on the patio or garage when not in use.

Recycling | The attached guide has all the details you need to responsibly dispose of waste. Curbside recycling, electronics, hazardous waste, or construction debris, it covers it all!

Announcements

- Spring is here! So is the wind. Please pick up any errant trash you may see as you bring in your trash toters to store out of sight. Ensure that the lid on your recycle bin is firmly closed when placed on the curb, to prevent litter from blowing out into the neighborhood.
- This is also the time to assess your patio and/or deck for potential maintenance. Is your patio cracked and in need of repair or replacement? Does your patio fence and/or deck need to be rebuilt, repaired, or re-stained? If so, this is the time to do it.
- Parking in the driveways is NOT allowed. You may park in front of your garage (if you have the room to do so and it does not impede your neighbor's access to their garage) or in a designated parking area, but NOT in the drive. The drives need to be open and accessible for emergency vehicles, such as police, fire, and ambulances.

Rules and Regs

Each issue, we will highlight a section(s) of *Timber Creek Condominium Association's Rules and Regulations*.

• Section III H. Landscaping:

- A border may be placed around planting beds. Borders may not be placed around individual trees. Obtain Association approval before purchasing any border material.
- Flowers may be planted in planting beds. Written
 approval from the Board is not necessary. The association
 reserves the right to require the removal of any planting
 that is deemed unsightly, or a maintenance or safety
 hazard. The unit Owner is responsible for the
 maintenance and upkeep of the planting bed.
- Trellises with climbing vines will be allowed upon Association approval and specifications.
- Additional bushes or shrubs may be planted in planting beds provided they complement the existing plantings.
 The Association will approve such plantings on an individual basis.

RECYCLE RIGHT

This handy guide shows you what you can recycle, and where you can recycle the item if it is not part of the City's curbside recycling program.

Curbside recycling with Groot:

Plastic:

All bottles with numbers 1 to 5 & 7

Metal Items:

- aluminum cans
- aluminum foil
- steel or tin cans
- aluminum baking trays
- empty aerosol cans

Glass Items:

- bottles and jars only
- brown, green, and clear glass

Paper Items:

- printer paper, school papers
- newspaper
- magazines, catalogs
- corrugated cardboard flattened
- cereal, pasta, soda or clothing boxes.
- telephone directories, brown paper (grocery) bags.
- juice & milk cartons
